

Why Are you Stuck in a Language-Learning Plateau?

- **Shortage of vocabulary**, makes you feel insecure about your message because it's not precise.

Now it's time to use more suitable descriptive adjectives and strong verbs. Now you can use "navy blue" or "light blue" instead of simply "blue" or you have to know the difference between "eat" and "feed."

One way to deal with this is to read extensively. You can also look for specific vocabulary according to different situations. Let's suppose you want to describe a person you saw in the street in details. Look for descriptions of people online and choose phrases that help you describe your person. Then try to use the new phrases as much as you can. This way they'll become part of your new vocabulary.

- **Speaking and Writing** the language is much more complex than reading and listening.

Expressing your thoughts and feeling in a foreign language can be a challenge. The only way of improving your performance in this area is constant practice. Speak and write regularly. Become an active social media participant will give you the opportunity of express yourself and share your adventures with your peers.

- **More steady effort is necessary** to progress less. This is just the result of complexity.

How Can you Overcome This Language-Learning Plateau?

- **Make a plan of work.** If you're serious about your progress you need to plan your activities in advance. As you know, when you don't plan, you plan to fail. Schedule your activities so you know what you'll be doing.
- **Set small goals with deadlines.** Even if you have a big goal to achieve at the end of the next three months, set baby goals for each day. This way you'll be happy to achieve them and have a sense of progress.
- **Get an accountability partner** to whom you have to report your progress. We are all humans, and from time to time, we get discouraged. You can avoid this if you tell somebody about your progress. He can be a friend or a significant other. The point is to have somebody who will be expecting you to do your job.
